UP TO THE MOMENT

How we help:

- <u>286</u> individuals served
- 24 families/ 29 children

HOW DONATIONS HELP!

Family Rooms: Three rooms were built in the Ottawa shelter dedicated to housing families as a unit within our program. A playroom was furnished by a local girl scout for her Gold Award. Thanks to volunteers and Fairmount Minerals.

Remodeled Kitchen: Food is a very basic need for everyone. We were not able to provide enough food since our kitchen was inadequate to cook from scratch. The Health Dept. has approved and licensed our renovation of the kitchen. We are receiving donated food as well as cooking food. **Floors:** Thanks to Pat Bryson for ceramic tiling the kitchen and dining room floors at the Ottawa shelter. **Painting:** Thanks to Noah Rimes for painting outside of Ottawa shelter. New beds: Peru's wooden beds were falling apart and Ottawa needed more beds. We have purchased 10 sets of military style bunk beds and mattresses for each shelter. The wooden modified frames and a mattress will go to clients moving to an apartment.

Inside Moments..

Volunteers are wonderful and we truly appreciate them. I would like to share a volunteers experience and I hope that it encourages you to consider volunteering. Monica writes: "My experience at PADS has been a gift. I could be having the worst day and then I get to the shelter and it goes away. The people there have become an important part of my life. Serving food, cleaning bunks, doing laundry, making coffee, or Kool-Aid was satisfying and I did not once minded doing it. Every client has made some impression on me. Some have become special. We are all human beings. We all need someone to listen or to get a hug or smile from someone. My kids have so much more compassion for people no matter who, what, where, when, how or why." Success Stories of the Moments...

This summer I answered the door at one of the shelters. It was a young man who had once been a client about 6 years ago. He was traveling through the area going back home to Rockford after being release from a hospital downstate. He was almost out of gas and money. We put gas in his tank. He shared what he had been doing with his life. While he stayed with us, we asked him what his dream job would be. He wanted to start a tree service. We encouraged him that it was not an impossible dream, and staff and volunteers began listening and sharing how he could accomplish this. He stated that this encouragement stayed with him as he moved on in his life. Four years ago he started and now manages his own tree service in Rockford. He works alone or hires daily helpers and was so excited about his work. We were so glad to hear from him and how well he is doing.

This last spring a man came into the shelter. He had been employed in a shelter program in Iowa where the management decided to downsize the program while refocusing their mission. His unemployment had expired and he was homeless. While he stayed with us, we learned about his experience along with observing his character. This year, he is an employee at one of the shelters. This is an unusual situation but we are proud to have him on our team.

Lily Pads Resale Boutique just celebrated the 7th year anniversary in August and has been at the present location for 5 years on October 15. Thanks to the volunteers, staff, donors and customers for making a real difference in the lives of so many by providing income for the shelters as well as income for employment for community members.
